



Chaves County 4-H Ambassador Program

The Chaves County 4-H Ambassador Program will strive to provide Senior 4-H members the opportunity to develop and practice advanced leadership skills relating to mentoring other youth and to becoming advocates for their selected ambassadorship area.

Mentorship. Ambassadors will conduct educational workshops for new and experienced members. Through mentoring, ambassadors will develop their public speaking skills as well as valuable relationships with other 4-H members.

Advocacy. Ambassadors will have the opportunity to advocate for their selected ambassadorship area by communicating with civic groups, social media, the radio and newspaper. In addition, ambassadors will be able to share their personal story of the positive impact 4-H has had on their life.

Ambassadorship. Ambassadors will choose their ambassadorship area when applying to serve. Historically, the ambassadorship has been limited to livestock, however ambassadorships are now being expanded to the following categories; livestock, shooting sports, and other project areas within Ag and Natural Resources and FCS.

- Help recruit for and participate in fairgrounds cleanup prior to county fair
- Assist at the Chaves County 4-H & FFA Fair with livestock sale
- Write an article for the Chaves County 4-H Newsletter "Be an Ag-vocate!" page (Topic should be educational and related to your species)
- Complete an end of term evaluation activity

- Attach with application:

 - Letter of Recommendation (Non-family member)
- Interview with Extension 4-H Agent
- Must be available to serve from November of current year to September of the following year
